- Conduct research in the realms of Rehabilitation, Health Administration, Public Health and other related health care fields.
- Work and thrive in academia with the development of innovative research projects and grant writing expertise.

CURRICULUM & APPLICATION QUALIFICATIONS

The Ph.D. in Health Sciences degree requires the completion of 72 credits including:

- 18 credits Transferred from Master's degree (Up to 18 credits may be awarded based on review and analysis of transcript)
- 18 credits Core curriculum, including at least 9 credits of Research Design/Statistics
- 18 credits Specialty Area
- 18 credits Ph.D. Dissertation

Applicants to the Ph.D. in Health Sciences degree program must complete a phone interview with members of the DCHI Admissions Committee and demonstrate the following qualifications:

 Verification of Master's degree received in Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Speech-Language Pathology, Public Health, Health Administration/Health Management Systems or other related field from Duquesne University, OR other accredited domestic or international university/college.

- Official GRE score of at least 310
- Official transcripts of all prior coursework
- A professional letter of recommendation
- Personal statement/essay
- Statement of Financial Sponsorship from personal bank account, a medical institution, university/college or governmental agency
- Verification of Language Competence:
 - Tests and minimum scores:
 - IELTS Minimum score 6.5
 - TOEFL Minimum score 80
 - Duolingo Minimum score 100
