The College of Natural and Health Sciences' (CNHS) rigorous, high quality curricula prepares students for careers in the physical, chemical and biological sciences, health sciences, human performance and sport management.

Dedicated faculty members renowned in their respective fields teach all laboratory-based courses. Their commitment to individual student instruction is supported by a University heavily invested in providing the finest teaching and research facilities, including new laboratories and state-of-the-art equipment and instrumentation. Whether conducting research alongside their professors, working with clinicians to diagnose and treat patients or interning locally or abroad, our students are applying their knowledge to address real-world issues throughout the Tampa Bay area and beyond.

1) *The waterfront marine science field station, located seven miles from campus, is a 3,000-square-foot facility equipped to serve both students and faculty in marine science, environmental studies and biology programs. Several marine science courses take place in the facility during the academic year, including marine botany, marine zoology, invertebrate zoology, general ecology, marine ecology, ichthyology and environmental microbiology.* **2)** *Nursing students work in the nursing skills and simulation laboratory that simulates acute hospital and long-term care in a safe, risk-free environment.* **3)** *At UT's Human Performance Research Lab, students use industry-leading technology to evaluate cardiovascular capacity, metabolic systems and human performance.* **4)** *Dan Huber, chair and professor of environmental studies, is a frequent contributing expert on the National Geographic Channel. Huber, who researches feeding and swimming biomechanics of sharks, has been a media favorite for more than 15 years.* **5)** *CNHS students have access to dedicated research labs as well as several chemistry and biology labs that are all fully outfitted to hold courses and conduct research.*

EARLY DECISION NOV. 1 DEADLINE

If accepted, applicants are contractually obligated to withdraw applications from all other institutions and confirm their UT enrollment by Jan 15. They receive full consideration for merit scholarships.

EARLY ACTION NOV. 15 DEADLINE

The most popular way to apply to UT. Applicants are not contractually obligated to attend UT and have until May 1 to confirm enrollment. They receive full consideration for merit scholarships.

REGULAR DECISION FEB. 1 DEADLINE

Admissions to some majors are typically more competitive for students applying Regular Decision. Applicants have until May 1 to confirm their UT enrollment.



TRANSFER applicants from two- and four-year colleges or universities are encouraged to apply at least one semester before they plan to enroll. Transfer applications are evaluated on a rolling basis.
